Is this course for me?

Section 2: Programme content and structure

Your classes

- English lessons will explore British culture and some history.
- Your classes will take place at one of the university buildings — a short walk from your accommodation.
- The modern classrooms are all equipped with data projectors.

Your meal plan

- A modern campus dining facility is either in or a short walk from the accommodation.
- Breakfast and lunch are provided every day with a choice of meals (cash cards may be used for lunch).

Your accommodation (London - South Bank)

- You will live in one of LSBU's halls of residence.
- The residence offers single rooms with a private bathroom arranged in shared flats, with a communal

- kitchen dining room for each flat (please note the kitchen is not available for cooking).
- There is also a social room and laundry facility on site.

Your accommodation (London - University of London)

- You will live in the International Hall residence.
- The residence offers a choice between single standard rooms with shared bathroom facilities and access to shared pantries (not available for cooking) OR single en suite rooms with a private bathroom and kitchenette in the room (not available for cooking).
- There are various social spaces, laundry facilities and dining facilities on site.

Social activities

- Your programme includes 1 x organised full-day visit per week
- You will also be able to join 4 x evening activities per week

Full-day excursions (included in the price)

Typical destinations include:

- Brighton — with Royal Pavilion
- Oxford — with Punting
- Hastings — with Tea Museum & afternoon tea
- Cambridge — with Pembroke College

Please note 16 and 17 year olds will need to have some level of supervision at all times.

Entrances and travel included in cost

Full day to Canterbury and Cathedral

- Price: £50
- Canterbury Cathedral is home of the Archbishop of Canterbury, leader of the Church of England.
- It had huge religious and political significance in medieval times, and its importance as a centre of pilgrimage increased further after the murder of Thomas Becket there in 1170.

Full day to Greenwich

- Price: £25
- Including visits to the the Royal Observatory and shopping time in Stratford

Full day to Leeds Castle

- Price: £53
- A beautiful castle set in the stunning countryside of Kent.
- The castle is a wonderful example of Tudor-style architecture. Many important historical figures have stayed and lived there.

Entrances only (accessible by public transport)

Thames River Cruise

- Price: £15
- Experience London's most iconic sights while navigating Thames river.

London Eye

- Price: £36
- The London Eye is a giant Ferris wheel on the South Bank of the River Thames in London. The structure is 135 metres tall and the wheel has a diameter of 120 metres.
- When it was built in 1999 it was the world's tallest Ferris wheel.

The View from the Shard

- Price: £33
- Experience some of the most incredible views of London from the viewing deck of the Shard.
- The tallest building in Europe when it was built, the Shard stands at 306 metres tall.

Tower Bridge Experience

- Price: £16
- London's Tower Bridge has become one of the city's most iconic structures, and offers fabulous views from its glass-floored high-level walkways.
- A permanent exhibition explains the history and engineering of this unique Victorian bridge.

IFS Cloud Cable Car (optional to include Uber Boat)

- Price: £15 (£25 with optional Uber Boat)
- Soar above London in the IFS Cable Car for a unique view of the city.
- Opened in 2012, the Cable Car reaches 90 metres above the Thames.

St. Pauls Cathedral

- Price: £27
- St Paul's Cathedral sits at the highest point of the City of London.
- The present church dates back to the late 17th century, and was designed by Sir Christopher Wren as was part of a major rebuilding programme after the Great Fire of London.
- It hosts some of the highest profile weddings and funerals in the UK.

Kensington Palace

- Price: £29

- Kensington Palace, whose first royal residents were King William III and Queen Mary II, was built in 1605 by Sir George Coppin.
- It has always been the home of one royal or another, and its most recent inhabitants were the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge.

Madame Tussauds

- Price: £32
- Madame Tussauds is a museum that contains waxwork models of famous people.
- You can visit a range of different collections, have your picture taken alongside A – list celebrities, and for something a little scarier brave the Chamber gallery where infamous serial killers lurk!

Tower of London

- Price: £40
- The Tower of London is a 900-year-old castle and fortress in central London that is notable for housing the crown jewels and for holding many famous and infamous prisoners.
- Throughout its history, the tower has served many purposes: it housed the royal mint, a menagerie, an armoury and barracks for troops.

Frameless - Immersive Art Experience

- Price: £31
- A new way to look at some of the most famous works of the most famous works of art in the world, Frameless is an incredible multi-sensory art exhibition.
- Visit four different rooms, each with a specific theme exploring the world of art in a unique, immersive way.

London Dungeon
